
Learning the major scale is the foundation for creating melodies and ultimately playing ukulele solos. The notes within this pattern will generally sound good when played with the matching key (ie. Play notes from the C major scale with songs in the Key of C)

Practice

- Playing through the C Major Scale forwards and backwards
- Start by playing very slow and gradually increase your speed
- Using a metronome at 60, 70, 80, 90 BPM
- Saying the notes to yourself as your play
- Choose 3-4 notes from this pattern to create your own melody.
- Choose a song in the Key of C to play along with (Ex. Somewhere Over The Rainbow)

Now Try

- · Shifting the pattern to play the D Major Scale
- Notice the pattern is using the same intervals without the open strings.
- · Say the notes to yourself
- Try singing Doe..Ray..Mi etc. as you pay through the scale.
- Derive a few notes from the scale and create your own melody. Start simple!
