

## **Tuning Your Ukulele**

**Top string to bottom:** G - C - E - A

Alternate: F# - B - D# - G#

## **Notes + Tips**

Keeping your instrument in tune is paramount to achieving pleasant sound. With variable temperatures and humidity levels throughout the year, your instrument is bound to slip out of tune. I recommend tuning before every practice session. Avoid keeping your instrument in extreme hot or cold places.

## **Checklist:**

- 1. Keep a clip on tuner in your ukulele case or clipped to your ukulele at all times. I recommend clip on tuners that pick up the instrument's vibration for the most accurate tuning. Snark Supertight is currently my tuner of choice.
- 2. Tune often! If something sounds funky, your uke is probably out of tune.
- Make small adjustments when twisting the tuning pegs, gradually raising or lowering the pitch.

- 4. While twisting the tuning pegs, continuously pluck the string with the thumb of your strumming hand.
- 5. Always raise a note to pitch. For example, if your tuner is reading A on the G string, loosen your tuning peg until the tuner F or F#. Then tighten the string back up to G.
- 6. Change your strings at least once every season to achieve the best tone.
- 7. Tune often!
